Winyah Chapter Scholarship Fact Sheet

Winyah Chapter Scholarship is funded by our Fundraiser held every year. The amount of the award for each Scholarship is based on the actual income from the event.

Applicants should follow the instructions carefully on the Scholarship Checklist and Application form, and review the criteria for the scholarship to verify that the criteria is met. The Winyah Chapter is thrilled to offer our generous scholarship program and will consider all applications which meet the criteria.

Please follow instructions carefully.

To be awarded a scholarship, the high school senior must be accepted for enrollment in an accredited two or four year college/university or technical school.

The applications must be received no later than March 13, 2020.

All applicants must be citizens of the US and must attend, or plan to attend, an accredited two or four year college, university or technical school in the US.

Only applications completed correctly and submitted in one package will be considered. Incorrect applications are discarded and no records are returned. Scholarships are awarded regardless of race, religion, sex, or national origin. Personal photographs must not be submitted.

Awards are placed on deposit with the college or university and any unused portion shall be returned to Winyah Chapter DAR. Awards are based on academic excellence, letters of reference, essay and other noted criteria. No affiliation with DAR is necessary. All scholarship applications must be received by March 15 to the address listed.

Scholarship Requirements:

1. Pursue an accredited 2 or 4 year program or technical school in preparation for a degree or certification for career
2. Attain a Grade Point Average of 3.5 or higher
3. Perform Volunteer Community Service during the 2019/2020 academic year *Examples of Volunteer activities include, but are not limited to: preparing/serving/delivering meals to needy, elderly or infirmed; participation in beach/river cleanup; organizing canned food drive; hospital, clinic or shelter volunteer; assisting with/at fundraiser for non-profit charity or community organization; volunteering for summer or after school programs for the needy or disabled.*
4. Provide SAT/ACT scores
